Principal of college, Prof. Dr Chander Shekhar was the chief Guest of the awareness program and was attended by faculty members and the students of the institution with great zeal and enthusiasm. The Programme was very productive and full of information as the UTDRF threw light on and demonstrated major first aid situations like CPR (Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation) i.e. how we can save a precious life through CPR in an emergency like situation. Further, the team focused on certain other first aid measures which one can adopt during emergency like natural calamities like earthquake, fire, accidents and like on what to do when a person is bitten by snake, first aid during accident, bleeding, fracture, burn injuries and choking. The team suggested various simple but effective measures to be adopted as first aid measures. The team also presented demonstration to the students so that they can use of certain equipment like fire extinguisher to extinguish fire and not feel panic in times of adversity and emergency but to act smartly and wisely. The team had also brought emergency rescue vehicle with them to show the equipments of the vehicle. The main aim of the programme was to open eyes of the students towards real life situation and practically show the students to deal with real life problems.
